Oxfordshire Past 2005 will be held in the Village Hall, Eynsham on May 7th 2005. The organisers this year are Eynsham History Group, whose President, Brian Atkins, will open proceedings at 10.00a.m. before Paul Smith, County Archaeologist, gives his annual review of discoveries in Oxfordshire. The full programme for the day is on p. 4.

The cost of the day will be £5, including coffee and tea. Lunch is not included; there are many places in Eynsham where lunch may be bought, or you may prefer to bring a packed lunch. A map of places selling lunch will be available on the day.

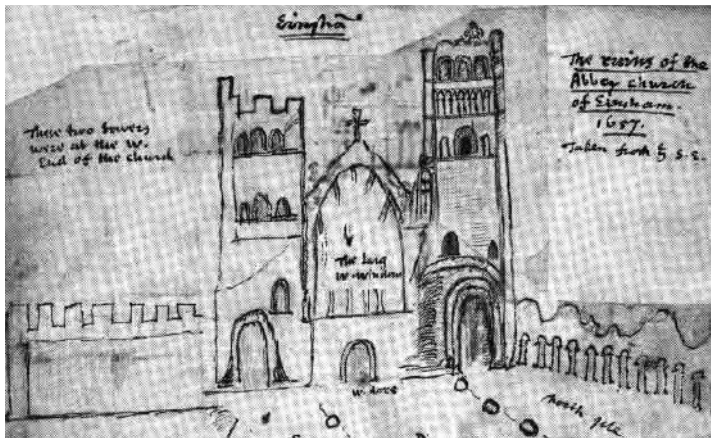
All attendees, including exhibitors, are required to book and pay admission.

Eynsham Abbey

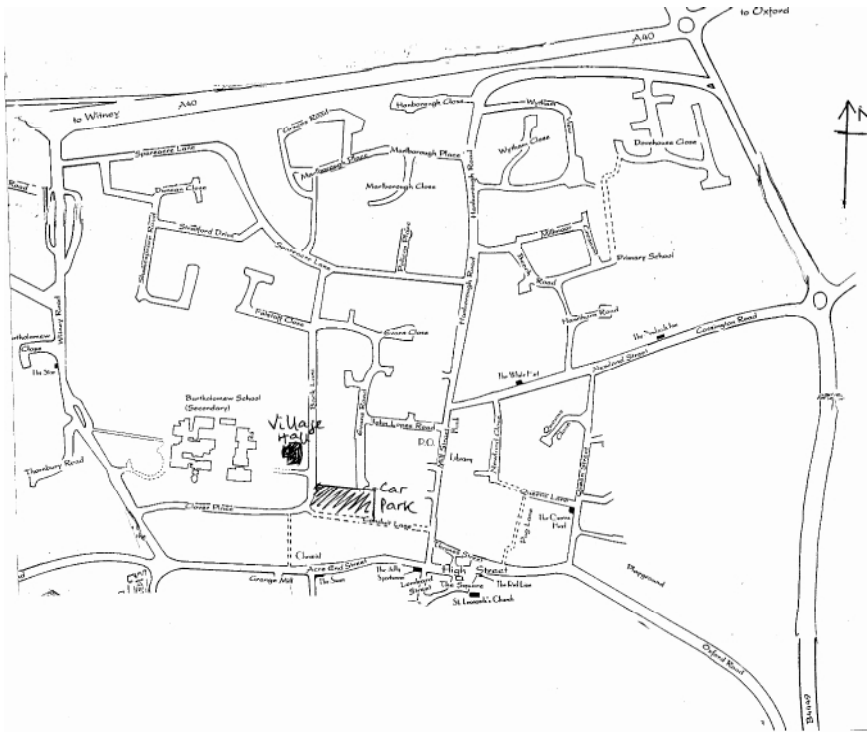
2005 marks the millennium of the foundation of Eynsham Abbey. In the Middle Ages, there was a huge abbey in Eynsham. The first Abbot was Aelfric, a famous scholar. But the monks fled to Stow when the Normans came in 1066, and the abbey was destroyed. They returned to rebuild it nearly 40 years later (1109). The abbey became famous all over the south; it is supposed to have been bigger than Oxford in the days before the University. There is an Abbey Heritage Walk round the Abbey precinct, with illustrations of the Abbey as it may have looked from various viewpoints.

Eynsham History Group has organised an exhibition in the Bartholomew Room in the Square of artefacts from Eynsham Abbey, mostly discovered by Oxford Archaeology in the 1990s, and loaned by the County Museum.

Getting to Eynsham Village Hall:

By car: There is a free car park close to the Village Hall (see map)

By bus: Buses (Stagecoach service 100) leave Oxford every 15 minutes from either George St. or New Road during road repairs (please check which at the time with Stagecoach:(01865) 772250). Leave the bus either at the first stop in the village, and walk via the footpath 'Conduit Lane', or the next stop and walk via 'Wastie's Lane' both of which are shown by dotted lines on the map. Return, via Conduit Lane, to the main bus stop in High Street by 'Martins'. Buses run every 15 minutes.
